

**EXCERPTS FROM
THE IMPORTANCE OF A WILL**

Paragraph 1...

Is it important to have a Will? This seemingly simple question has many answers! Without a Will you cannot select your executor or executors, that is, the person or persons who administer your estate. In the absence of a Will the Court will select someone to fill this role.

Paragraph 3...

Without a Will, provincial legislation will distribute your estate to relatives--no matter how distant--but no other individuals or institutions will benefit. If you have been involved with one or more charities during your life and you intended to make a final gift to promote their work, your charitable intentions will ...

Paragraph 5...

If there are children under the age of 18 who share in your estate and you die without a Will, the Court appointed administrator is obliged to ...

Summary Paragraphs...

A properly drawn Will often results in increased tax savings, both at the time of death and afterwards. These tax savings would not be available without a Will.

With all of these factors to consider, can you afford *not* to have a Will?
